Welcome to the Seventh Grade Reading!

During the summer, please read the following two (2) novels and complete the adjoining activities.

1. Novel: Johnny Tremain by Esther Forbes
2. Novel: Nightjohn by Gary Paulsen

Activity #1:

Define what is meant by the genre historical fiction (be specific). Explain how and why both books, Johnny Tremain and Nightjohn, fit the genre of historical fiction.

Activity #2:

As proof of his Lyte ancestry, Johnny's mother gave him a precious silver cup. The cup is an heirloom, a valuable possession handed down from one generation to another. What special heirloom do you or a member of your family possess? How did you/they come to own it? Why is it meaningful? Where do you hope the heirloom will be 100 years from now?

Activity #3:

Esther Forbes's novel ends with these words: "Rab had died. Hundreds would die, but not the thing they died for". The patriots believed strongly in America. They truly loved America. **List** and **explain** four ways you show your love of America.
